One of the most compelling messages I have received in my call to Biltmore Baptist church is the need to reconnect with the Biltmore community. When the community was first built in 1929, it was not anchored with a shopping center, or a mall, or an entertainment complex or a recreation center – it was anchored with a church.

Biltmore Baptist church enjoyed many years serving as the social focal point for this growing suburban community. It was planted during terrible financial conditions and a crashing US economy. Only the basement was usable. But, as the economy prospered, so did the community and the church grew strong and tall into its current sanctuary.

Somewhere along the line members moved out of the neighborhood and over time the strong, purposeful bond with the community was lost. I believe that God is telling us that the key to restoring Biltmore Baptist church is in restoring that neighborhood connection.

The Lord has laid on my heart a strategic plan for reengaging the Biltmore community and our mission needs to focus on four objectives:

- A Reconnect with the community
- Ositively impact the community
- Minister to the community
- Partner with the community

How are we going to achieve our mission? We are starting a program called Biltmore Good Neighbor.

On February 8, 1929, a group met at Longdale School for the purpose of organizing a Baptist church. A list of names—74 in number—who had requested their letters from North Run Baptist Church, was read.

A resolution was adopted that these constitute the membership of a new Baptist church. A motion was made by L.A. Binford and seconded by W.T. Francis that the name of the new church be **BILTMORE BAPTIST CHURCH**.

The new congregation met for its first worship service on Sunday, February 9, 1929.


